DAVID ROME, JUDITH NEFSKY, and PAULE OBERMEIR—*Les Juifs du Québec: bibliographie rétrospective annotée.* Québec: Institut québécois de recherche sur la culture, 1981. Pp. xvi, 317. (Collection "Instruments de travail", n° 1)

This superb annotated bibliography of material on all aspects of Quebec's Jewish history, which was composed by David Rome—the dean of Canadian Jewish historians—Judith Nefsky and Paule Obermeir is the first of a series promised by *l'Institut québécois de recherche sur la culture* and constitutes an indispensable tool for those interested in research on the history of the Jewish people in the Province of Quebec from that community's eighteenth-century origins to the present. Organized chronologically according to the main periods of Jewish immigration and settlement, this work lists secondary sources on the political, economic, social, religious and cultural life as well as on many aspects of their relations with the French and English populations. The utility of this bibliography would have been even greater had its compilers also listed the many important primary sources available in the Canadian Jewish Congress Archives in Montreal and the Public Archives of Canada. It is, nevertheless, a most welcome and noteworthy accomplishment as well as a landmark to the greatly improved relations between Quebec's Jews and their fellow *Québécois*.

EDWINNA VON BAEYER —*L'histoire du jardinage au Canada. Bibliographie provisoire.* Ottawa, Direction des lieux et des parcs historiques nationaux, Parcs Canada, Environnement Canada, 1983, 26 p.

Voici un instrument de travail qui sera utile à ceux qui s'intéressent à l'histoire du jardinage, de la botanique, de l'horticulture et même de l'agriculture, depuis la première moitié du xixe siècle en particulier. Cet inventaire ne donne pas seulement la liste des inventaires bibliographiques déjà publiés: il énumère aussi les brochures, les manuels, les études et les revues. Il n'oublie pas non plus les journaux des voyageurs et des explorateurs et il insiste en outre sur les travaux portant sur des institutions telles que les fermes expérimentales, les jardins botaniques, les jardins historiques, les jardins d'écoliers, les jardins septentrionaux, les parcs, les écoles d'agriculture et les associations.
